And let's stick to our principles, but never doubt the sincerity of each other to end conflicts, not inflame them.

I'm reminded of a speech that U.S. Senator Robert Kennedy made on 4 April 1968, that dreadful day when the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated.


Kennedy was in Indianapolis speaking to an audience in a predominantly African American neighborhood where people had yet to learn that Dr. King had been killed. He shared the terrible news. He honored Dr. King for all he had done for the cause of justice and peace. And then he connected with the fuming, grieving crowd by saying:

"For those of you who are Black and are tempted to be filled with hatred and distrust at the injustice of such an act, against all white people, I can only say that I feel in my own heart the same kind of feeling. I had a member of my family killed." It was the first time he had spoken publicly about President John F. Kennedy's assassination. And while many American cities exploded in violence that night, Indianapolis did not.

It is in times of crisis and despair that we need empathy most of all. Empathy is the most powerful tool of peace, and it is vital if we are to take the first brave, humble steps to

Hospital Permai Johor Bahru (HPJB) is the largest mental hospital in the Southern region serving more than 600 patients including adolescents. They have 4 wards of about 100 patients in total where patients there stay long term and the some patients have been there for over 25 years or more. Most of them are elderly and the oldest is 89 years. These patients were never discharged because they are not able to find their family members/relatives after they have been treated at HPJB but still need guardians to take care of their well being (take medicine on time, not fit to work etc..). These elderly patients mostly need help with mobility and hence wheelchairs and commode chairs are urgently needed after community assessments made by Rotary Club of Pontian (the organizing chair).

The Adolescent's Ward needed a large SMART TV to play videos to help mental health exercises.

3 other clubs in Johor namely Rotary Club of Puteri Lagoon Johor Bahru, Rotary Club of Bandar Penggaram Mandarin & Rotary Club of Johor Bahru Sentral joined The Rotary Club of Pontian to make an impact with this project to benefit the old patients at Hospital Permai Johor Bahru on 19th March 2024. A total of 12 Rotarians involved in the hand over.

A total of 12 heavy duty wheel chairs, 14 Commode Chairs, a 65-inch Smart TV and stand and 4 units of digital Blood Pressure (BP) monitors were donated from the 4 clubs to make the elderly patients and the adolescent patients (13 to 18 years) comfortable.
