MY GREATEST CHALLENGE IN ROTARY

President Angelia Tio Leong—Rotary Club of Serangoon Gardens Orchard, Singapore

Assuming the presidency of my club for the second time after twenty years poses for me the greatest challenge in Rotary. Thrusting me into the forefront of the club, not only is it rejuvenation for me, it is also a responsibility to rejuvenate the club under the broader Rotary International Year theme of REACH WITHIN TO EMBRACE HUMANITY.

Rejuvenating the club certainly is not a one person's effort. I therefore wish to thank all members of RCSGO and other Rotarians whose initiatives and dynamism have provided me with the motivation and help. DG Zainie Aucasa, AG Chew Ban Seng, CP Dr. Jeffrey Po and PP Dr. Mukundan Nair, who have given their unstinting encouragement are worthy of special mention.

A chief aim in improving the club is building up the membership. We started the Rotary year with 13 members and have so far increased by seven members, meeting AG's recommendation of a small club achieving the target of 20 members or more.

Of course, increasing membership must be complemented by a program of encouraging closer bonding among our members and with our Singapore Management University Rotaractors and sister clubs. Activities we have organised have included those involving family members.

This year we embarked on a new initiative in our community service program by adopting an orphanage in Batam with the help of PP Cathy Loh. This is the Berkat Bangsa Orphanage and we have furnished their home with book shelves, and tables for studies and dining. We have also brought over to them books, toys and games and supplies of food every three months.

The club has had an active Avoidable Blindness program. We had vision care check-ups for senior citizens at three Community Centres in Singapore, initiated by CP Jeffrey Po. We also had Dr. Ajeet Wagel to talk on Age-related Macular Degeneration to the club, and provided used spectacles to senior citizens in Singapore. RCSGO is the only club in District 3310 which has vision care programs in all avenues of service.

In other community service areas, we have provided assistance to a priest in counselling sex workers in Singapore's red light district. We also assisted in organising a health check for senior citizens in Toa Payoh, and, since 1990, have continued to visit and provide support to the hospice home of St. Joseph.

RCSGO was given a certificate by Minister Shamugan for sponsoring the event to create the biggest rangooli. The event was coordinated by Vijaya, wife of our PP Mohan.

In vocational service areas, RCSGO organised a vocational talk and forum at Singapore Management University to students and Rotaractors. A vocation award was given to the best staff of the hotel, where the club holds its meeting. Another vocational service event was a visit to one of the biggest chicken processing plants in Singapore, which slaughters 30,000 chickens a day. PP Cathy has road shows in her travel agency where she accepted a couple of students there to see how they work.

Rtn. Teresa Tso, on her own initiative, organised the printing of 1000 business size card calendars for 2012 with the Rotary logo and message to promote Rotary. It has been distributed to Rotarians and students of Singapore Management University.

In the international service area, we had a joint project with our sister club RC Makati Legaspi in Phillipines. This involved the donation of sacks of rice for a year to the Tuloy Orphanage home in Alabang. We also donated a shelter box to Indonesia through DGN Eva.

We are proud that we manage to have renowned speakers during the past months through PP Leong Cheng Chit.

As we approach the end of the current Rotary year, I and, I believe, our members have certainly been super energised.

DG's VISIT TO INTERACT CLUB OF KOLEJ YAYASAN SAAD, 2ND FEBRUARY 2012 AND CLUB ACTIVITIES

Interact Club of Kolej Yayasan Saad with a membership of fifty-six Interactors, was chartered on 11 July 2008. It is sponsored and guided by Rotary Club of Malacca. The club's goals are to realize other people's suffering and to extend all possible help, working together in a world of fellowship dedicated to service and international understanding. Hence, thoughtfulness among members and helpfulness to others is encouraged as a practice among Interactors.

The Club's projects and activities are based on our motto "Service Above Self". Fundraising and community service are several of the Club's annual activities. Last year, several fundraising projects were organised in aid of Kiwanis Down Syndrome Foundation Melaka, Rumah Anak Yatim Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Al Haj and selected students of Kolej Yayasan Saad. Rotary Club of Malacca sponsored the expenses incurred for this project. A lazerjet printer was donated to the school during Teachers Day.

Under the leadership of President Muhammad Firdaus b. Muhammad Nadzri, it is hoped that selflessness would be instil among Interactors through the activities and training throughout the year 2012. This year the Club is raising funds for the mentally disabled children and adults through the sales of confectioneries. One of the highlight of this year's activities is the End Polio Campaign at school level.
