RYLA CAMP SANDAKAN - A TEACHER'S VIEW

"We have a powerful potential in our youth, and we must have the courage to change old ideas and practices so that we may direct their power toward good ends" - Mary McLeod Bethune.

There is so much potential in an individual but more often than we'd like to remember, we settle for less because it is easier. I do not wish that for my students. An opportunity came knocking on my door when I attended SINDEK programme (24th-25th Feb 2012) - Mr. Paul Chong told me about a sponsorship for two students to attend the RYLA camp. I had heard of this camp before and if the SINDEK programme was any indication, the camp must be terrific as well. So we went.

It was quite a long journey for these two students, from Lawas and Sipitang to Kimanis (they stayed the night at the hostel) then the next day to Inanam before going to Sandakan. Thankfully everything went smoothly and we arrived at the Sepilok Resort safely. The first day at the resort, my students received their first challenge. Everyone at the camp spoke English! Although the English language was not alien to these students, actually speaking the language was a different story. I remember observing them from my room, one of my students was standing with his back against the wall and simply looking at the crowd. Perhaps it's been a while since the last time they were taken out of their comfort zone.

The next few days were amazing. My students got to know the Law of Attraction, designed an evening gown (which is famously known as 'the Black Mamba' to the campers) from garbage bags, newspapers and recycled ribbons, learn the harmony concept of Aikido and practice its basic skills and they also performed in a short play. However, my greatest delight was that they got to practise English when communicating with the other campers there. I should note that I think they got so used to it that even as I was driving them back to our school in Kimanis, they spoke to me in English! They were telling me stories about the programme and their new friends, all in English - no more silly fear of using the language.

I must also note that Dr. Ali did a great job, as my students repeated his words with ease, "I'm an eagle, I don't mix with chickens". I should also mention it here that he is quite famous now in my school since Azamani is now jokingly addressed as 'Ali Qassem'. They must have been talking in the hostel.

It's been a while since the camp ended and I could safely say they walked out of the resort changed persons. Usually, it's hard to get a volunteer during P&P (teaching and learning) but Azamani volunteered to recite a poem in front of the class this week and Afiq voluntarily suggest his name to represent the school in public speaking competition next week. Who knows what is next for these two.

The programme has helped me as well. I have only been teaching for about two months and as a new teacher, sometimes the challenges and workloads are a little too much to bear but seeing your students benefitting from your effort, however little or big it might be, definitely restores your love and passion. I feel extremely fortunate to have had this opportunity to send and expose my students to such a great experience. I thank you Rotary Club so much. You all have done a great job for these kids and I hope you keep doing what you do. Thank you. RYLA indeed, was a good community service which I believe will benefit the youths for years and years to come.
