All disclosed that the expected completion period and issuance of occupancy certificate would be its months, upon approval of the building plan by the Penampang District Council and an operating license from the Ministry of Health.

There are currently 11 haemodialysis centres in Sabah, withons each at the Queen Rizabeth Hospital and the Sabah Women & Children's Hospital, Likus, five operated by non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and four by private organisations, with an overall total of 187 haemodialysis machines. Each machine caters for the needs of six patients since the patient three times a week.

"One machine therefore effectively treats two patients a day," All explained.

Haemodialysis also costs a sidney patient around RM3,000 a month, he said, but gave the

"It is very much in line with the philoso-phy that the good humanitarian works of Rotary begins with good leaders," he added.





AN INTERVIEW WITH DISTRICT 1St LADY HAJJAH KALIMAH



Supporting your spouse all the way because when you are the DG's other half, you are in for a very challenging but interesting ride. When your Rotarian husband has committed to his role as a DG, you must also be equally, if not more, committed into playing the role as his wife.

Q 2. Eleven months have passed by and only one month remaining for you to play the role of the wife of a District Governor. Are you satisfied with the role that you have played?.

In everything we do, we always feel that we could have done more, or could have done better... but I believe, I have played my role to the best I could. It is important for every spouse of a Rotarian to support their other half, and that is exactly what I have done. I believe, I have achieved in fostering close relationship and

bonding with the Rotarians and their families. My biggest reward is seeing the positive changes to our District, being part of what makes things happen and knowing that I have also played a role in changing the lives of others.

Q 3. I understand you have followed your husband in his official visit to all the 63 clubs in the District and almost all the events to which he was invited?. This is not an easy thing to do. What gave you the energy and motivation to do this?

My main motivation was meeting all the Rotarians across the District. Everyone I met along the way has added color to my life. There is nothing more motivating for me than the thought of travelling to new places and seeing for myself the great things the Rotarians have done, meeting again with old friends and making new ones.

Q 4. What was your most memorable moment?

I have so many memorable moments but there are a few that will always remain with me. One was when we joined RC Likas Bay to Siem Reap to take part in the Operations Smile, Cambodia. I was holding a four month baby girl before her Cleft Lip operation. The nervous part was when I handed her to the doctors and watched them put her to sleep. The joys were when seeing her after the operation with her beautiful lips and seeing too the grateful face of her mother.

The other memorable moment was when I witnessed at 2 am in the morning the Flag-of of the eight participants who took part in the Polio Free-Trans-Sabah Walk and Climb Mount Kinabalu. I saw them slowly disappeared into the darkness as they began their journey on the long winding road to Mount Kinabalu, the climb of 14, 455 feet and the tiring walk down to Kota Kinabalu. I was very proud of their achievements and very happy to welcome them at the finishing point in Kota Kinabalu.

Q 5. What was the most satisfying things that you have achieved?

In helping my husband to deliver his promise of becoming a twelve months DG and visited with him all the sixty three Rotary clubs, most of which were visited more than once for projects launching, anniversary celebrations and installations.

Q 6. How did your children cope with both of you constantly not being at home and very busy?

They are very supportive of our involvement in Rotary. In fact, they are what we call true Rotary Children. We involved them as much as we can in our Rotary activities and they are also friends with Rotarians. In terms of coping while we are away... I think if you are children of that age, you would like it when you're parents leave you home alone once in a while...
