I hope that you will have an energizing and productive PETS, and I know that great things are ahead for you this Rotary year—as you Engage Rotary, Change Lives.



Message: District Governor-Elect



Welcome to 23rd District President-Elect Training Seminar and District Assembly.

Every District throughout the Rotary world, conduct PETS and District Assembly around this time of the year as a means to impart the "Rotary Way" to run your respective clubs and District.

Much of the sessions are based on facilitated learning. You will not be lectured to. On the contrary you are encouraged to actively participate in all sessions, to share your ideas and experience. We hope that you will be able to take with you a few good and useful ideas by the end of the week.

This year, we have adjusted the PETS training to make it more interesting and meaningful. We will have a session on self-evaluation through the DISC program. (DISC is an acronym for Dominance, Influence, Steadiness, Compliance). I truly believe that we cannot be good and effective leaders unless we know our own strengths and weaknesses.

A Rotary leader won't survive very long using the leadership of a military commander. You cannot expect your fellow Rotarians to take orders.

He or she will not be effective using the leadership of an animal trainer either, whose tools are a whip and a chair.

Leadership in Rotary is very different. The skills of a successful Rotary leader working with volunteers like you and me involve special considerations. A Club President, for example cannot sack his team and hire a new one or dock their salary. You are not their boss.

Our Rotary Theme for next year is "Engage Rotary, Change Lives". Rotary International President-Elect Ron D. Burton wants us to share and to help other people to discover so that they can find the feelings for themselves. When Rotarians get involved – when they get engaged – lives change.

To achieve this, we have to take actions. At the International Assembly in San Diego, California, 537 In-coming Governors also receive training on how to run their districts. In-coming President Ron asked all of us to lead by example by contributing to The Rotary Foundation before we attend the International Assembly. He wanted us to be the "First Class" Governors. Needless to say, more than US\$675,000 was raised in this unprecedented call.

I ask you to lead by example in everything you do. It is only through leading by example that we can motivate all our members to go the extra mile.

If we care for the future of Rotary and want to take Rotary Service forward, we must make sure that Rotarians are engaged and each one of us is doing the most we can. We must make sure that every single Rotarian has the same feeling about Rotary. We need to make sure that every Rotarian has a

Message: District Trainer 2013-2014



It has been challenging putting up relevant training programs with appropriate and suitable facilitators/resource persons for all incoming club presidents and incoming club officers at Presidents Elect Training Seminar (PETS) and the 23rd District Assembly (DA).

With the recently concluded Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) Graduate Course in Kota Kinabalu, Sabah on 12th January 2013, the District is now slowly but surely building a pool of knowledgeable Rotarians who can serve beyond their respective clubs. Our long term aim is to select facilitators who have attended the RLI Graduate Course.

Training was also provided for all incoming Assistant Governors and incoming District Committee Chairs on 22 February 2013 in Johor Bahru followed by Train-The-Trainer workshop on the following day. The aim of the workshop was to provide facilitation skills to the incoming district officers in view of the strategy to engage them to conduct training sessions at PETS/DA. The workshop was made possible with great contributions of two professional trainers namely PP Kenneth Leow (RC Bugis Junction), Founder & Principal Consultant, Blue and Gray group of companies and Vanisa Lee, founder of Zeal Learningworks. They both contributed so much without any cost to the district. Most sincere appreciations to them.

By engaging the incoming district officers in the training sessions, many incoming club officers will be able to identify them and commence early engagements with them at this PETS/23rd DA.

Rotary Foundation is implementing the 'Future Vision Plan (FVP)' worldwide effective 1 July 2013 comprising of new policies and programs.

Hence, effective 1 July 2013, to be able to apply for any grants from Rotary Foundation, the following MOUs have to be signed:

- 1. Between District and Rotary Foundation (only a single MOU to cover the whole district) and
- 2. Between the Club (which is applying for the grant) and the District

One of the conditions required for club to sign MOU with the District is that the club concerned MUST send a representative to attend the District Grant Management Seminar. Since the MOU is to be signed by the club president & president elect and because of logistical constraints, the District Grant Management training session has been included at the 23rd District Assembly to be chaired by DGE Chew Ghim Bok.

Because of the importance of FVP, the 'Effective Public Speaking' session for PE (which has been included in past DAs) has now been removed. Instead, the Rotary Foundation/District Grant Management training session is now classified as the PE Track/Rotary Foundation Track.

Therefore I am encouraging all Presidents Elect (PE), incoming Assistant Governors, incoming Club Rotary Foundation Committee Chair/members and any other keen Rotarians to attend the District Grant Management training session.

The Mandarin training sessions are also continued to be made available for those who are more conversant with the Mandarin language. It is noted that there is an urgent need for the District to increase the pool of Mandarin speaking facilitators.

This year, we have the courtesies of the District Governor, many Past District Governors and District Governor Nominee helping out as resource persons not only at PETS but also at every training session at the District Assembly. We must thank the facilitators and resource persons for their willingness to help.

I must also thank PDG Fong Hoe Beng who is the advisor to the District Training Committee for the constant guidance and for suggesting the use of DISC, the leading personal assessment tool. This is the first time that DISC is being used at PETS for the PEs. If proven successful, we may want to extend it to other incoming club officers as well as Rotarians in general.

The DISC assessment can be used for a variety of real-life situations. Many companies use it as a way to screen potential employees, with the thought that a certain personality type would be better or worse in certain jobs or positions. Another field in which DISC assessment can be used is leadership. There are different leadership methods and styles that coincide with each personality type, which could help leaders be more effective. DISC has also been used to help determine a course of action when dealing with problems as a leadership team—that is, taking the various aspects of each type into account when solving problems or assigning jobs. The District Training Committee will review the result of the DISC profiles and determine if the same can be adopted as permanent feature for PETS/DA.

While every effort has been made to select the best talents for the jobs, we must remember that being facilitators are not the profession of these Rotarians. But they will give their very best. So if there are Rotarians out there who are experienced and good in facilitation, please come forward to contact me.

Feedback has been obtained whereby some attendees prefer training sessions to be in 'lecture/ presentation' mode while some prefer 'facilitation' mode. It is therefore difficult to cater for the needs of everyone as it depends on the subject matter being delivered.

However, I am sure the facilitators will bring a balance to their assigned training sessions so that each of you can derive the maximum benefit to run your club effectively and to enable you to reach out to those in need. What we need is your active participation.





Rotary Leadership Development Training Cycle

Because most Rotary clubs and districts change leadership annually, training is critical to ensure continuity.

The leadership development training cycle for Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation is based on integrated district training meetings. As the diagram below illustrates, each meeting to train incoming officers builds on the previous one to ensure that all club and district leaders share a common vision at the start of the Rotary year. Continuing education opportunities, including the district leadership seminar and district Rotary Foundation seminar, ensure that club and district leaders have current information about Rotary and its Foundation and that they develop leadership skills.

You will notice that RI provides job-specific training program. Hence to complement the RI training programs, the District became an affiliate of RLI (Rotary Leadership Institute). RLI provides general training which is suitable for both new and seasoned Rotarians.

What Is The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI)?

RLI is an outgrowth of D7510 Leadership Institute in 1992 (New Jersey, USA) – 20 years old. It is a multi-district, grassroots leadership development program of member districts organized into regional divisions in various parts of the world. The Institute is now a joint project of over 320 Districts in 180 countries.

It is a development program for potential Rotary club leaders (not necessarily as club presidents) because its contents provides Rotary knowledge & leadership skills. Enrollment is by nomination & sponsored by the club.

While it is not an official program of Rotary International, RLI has substantial support from the RI Board, which has adopted a resolution recommending RLI programs to the Rotary Districts worldwide. The CoL (Council on Legislation) twice recommended RLI to RI Board.

RLI believes that excellent CLUB leadership (all types of club leaders) is essential to the future of Rotary in a complex and fast changing world. Most Rotarians have not been exposed to the great scope of Rotary around the world and have not considered what leadership skills are necessary to move Rotary forward.

RLI strongly believes that a good Rotary Club leader must know the evolution of Rotary, its current status and activities in the world and have a vision for what Rotary can be in the future. Therefore, RLI provides a three day non-consecutive basic course in both Rotary knowledge and leadership skills, especially for voluntary organizations. In addition to the specific leadership skills sessions, all the RLI sessions have a leadership component.

In addition to the basic three day course, RLI holds in-depth seminars on important Rotary subjects, including leadership, for the "graduates" of the basic course.

The mission of RLI is to have the clubs in the member districts identify those with the potential for future club leadership and send them to RLI courses at club expense. All member clubs may send any club Rotarian to RLI courses and any Rotarian may attend any course at his/her own initiative.

The overriding goal of the courses for club Rotarians is to create ENTHUSIASM for Rotary by opening up to them the world of Rotary outside of their own clubs and also showing them the great potential of Rotary service for the benefit of the world that can be furthered with excellent leadership in our clubs.

- **Do not get Personal:** Personal attacks on persons or Clubs will not be tolerated. Please praise or criticize, in a constructive way and give specific examples or evidence as to why it is good or bad. General attacks of any kind on any person or Club or idea will be curtailed.
- **Stay on Topic:** Responses to any question should be on-topic and pertain to the discussion and please do not stray and prolong the Dialogue Session.
- **Do not Engage in Heated Banter:** Do not inspire heated rhetoric or raise pointless or offensive questions. Keep the tone of the Dialogue Session positive with a view to achieving the objectives.
- The Four-Way Test: Please be constantly guided by Rotary's Four-Way Test at all times.
- **Moderators:** Moderators shall have the final say to whether questions or issues posed from participants shall receive appropriate response, and the time duration for questions and responses.
