5. Achieved till 1 July 2015:

Increase of 51 members (↑ 3.0 %)

6. Recommendations:

a. What are we looking for in Rotary:

- i. Fun
- ii. Friendship
- iii. Opportunities
- iv. Mentorship

b. Recommendations or suggestions:

- i. Waive or reduce fees for the 1st year or 2
eg. To go by tier, waive for first 2 yrs, 50% for 3rd & 4yr, 75% for 5th, full on 6th
- ii. Reduce club meal expenses
- iii. Recruit Rotaractors, Interactors, GSE team members and other Rotary program alumni – eg. A program for clubs to recruit Rotaractors immediately once they leave Rotaract
- iv. Induct several young members at once so they feel more comfortable
- v. Make sure meetings are efficient, productive and fun
- vi. Alternative meeting arrangements such as e-clubs for make-up meetings
- vii. Keep them involved in Rotary activities
- viii. Listen to and act on ideas of younger members
- ix. Conduct service projects that appeal to younger members
- x. Mentorship – Is to get a senior Rotarian to enlighten Young Rotarians on Rotary and introduce Rotarians around them during meetings or gathering so that they don't feel out of place
- xi. Communicate weekly meetings via social media
- xii. Create club fellowship and networking activities that are convenient for younger professionals – more FUN
- xiii. Look at your traditions – are changes needed?
